### 4. First-Aid Measures

Eve Contact: Rinse thoroughly with water for at least 15 minutes, holding the eyelids open to be sure the material is washed out. Remove contact lenses if present and easy to do. Get medical attention of irritation develops or persists.

### 5. Fire-Fighting Measures
